G o l f

With five public and two private world-class golf courses designed by some of the most famous names in the history of the game, Kiawah Island has become synonymous with championship golf. It was home to the heart-stopping 1991 Ryder Cup Matches, the 1997 World Cup, and the 2003 WCG World Cup, the 2007 Senior PGA and it will host the 2012 PGA Tournament. Every Kiawah golf challenge is unique as each melds the lush, Lowcountry landscape with impeccable course maintenance, ensuring memorable views and rewarding play every time. Many visitors to the island enroll in Kiawah's golf school to sharpen their game in this championship environment.

T e n n i s

In recent rankings, Kiawah was rated the "#1 Tennis Resort in America" by Tennis Magazine. West Beach Tennis Center has 14 Har-Tru clay courts, two lighted hard courts and a backboard for practice. East Beach has nine Har-Tru courts, three hard courts, two lighted courts and a fully automated practice alley. Kiawah's tennis program features expert instruction and activities for all ages and skill levels. You'll also find matchmaking services, and exceptional pro exhibitions.

R e c r e a t i o n

Ten spectacular miles of unspoiled, private shoreline offers the perfect opportunity to relax, swim, stroll, sea kayak, or go beach seining. Start training for the Kiawah Island Marathon or bike on Kiawah's 30 miles of bicycle paths weaving through wooded areas of live oak, palmetto, sweet gum, magnolia and wax myrtle. Enjoy boating and water sports. Visit Night Heron Park for its wonderful sports fields, and fitness trail. The Straw Market's fitness center is an indoor resource for exercise, strength training and staying at peak performance – whatever your game. The options are nearly unlimited.

Nature Excursions

Discover and learn about Kiawah Island's unique barrier island ecology through a variety of fascinating nature study programs. Skilled naturalists offer tours by sea kayak, canoe or bike, as well as bird watching treks or nighttime beach walks. While exploring the island's long, uninterrupted beach, you'll learn that this is the nesting ground for the Loggerhead Sea Turtle, protected by a partnership by the town-sponsored Turtle Patrol and a federal- and state-permitted program involving island residents.

Open daily, Night Heron Park Nature Center is an excellent hub for information on nature tours, special events and creative ways to design your own eco-adventure. The Nature Center also has exhibits about the island's native flora and fauna, which includes 18 species of mammals, more than 30 species of reptiles and amphibians, and more than 140 species of birds.

Children and Family Activities

Designed for children age three to 11, the very popular Kamp Kiawah offers a myriad of engaging and educational activities sure to be a hit with the youngfolk. For tweens and teens, too, there are special activities and social events. Kiawah's themed "Summer Fun" activities offer entertainment, games and food for young people of all ages.
